Phillips: You asked questions and Hush didn't respond?

Damiani: They were nonresponsive. We asked specific questions and basically his response was award me the contract and I will provide you the responses.

Phillips: That is not how it works here and I don't know of any other municipality that works that way either. Do we have any questions on this?

RESOLUTION NO. 70 OF 2021 RATIFYING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT 2019-2021 BETWEEN ROCKLAND COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY AKA ROCKLAND GREEN AND LOCAL 456, INTERNATIONAL BROTHERHOOD OF TEAMSTERS

WHEREAS, Rockland County Solid Waste Management Authority ("Rockland Green") and the Local 456, International Brotherhood of Teamsters (the "Union"), have entered into a proposed Collective Bargaining Agreement, dated January 23, 2019 to December 31, 2021 and

WHEREAS, said Collective Bargaining Agreement, arrived at after negotiations between the respective parties with the approval of the executive committee of Rockland Green, provides for wage increases for the "Union" equivalent to the wage increases that non union employees of Rockland Green have received as well as the Union's withdrawal of two pending improper practice charges pending before the Public Employment Relations Board; and

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed that members of the Union employed by Rockland Green employed as of September 15, 2021 shall receive a one percent (1.0%) wage increase, effective January 1, 2020, and a two and a half percent (2.5%) wage increase, effective January 1, 2021, to be paid retroactively; and

WHEREAS, the Union shall withdraw two improper practice charges pending before the Public Employment Relations Board, numbered U37847 and U 37769; and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2021 the Union ratified the proposed Collective Bargaining Agreement between the Parties, said Collective Bargaining Agreement, twenty nine pages in length, containing the full scope of rights and responsibilities of the respective parties; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the proposed Collective Bargaining Agreement be accepted and ratified by Rockland Green and that the Executive Director is authorized and directed to sign any and all documents and to do and cause to be done any and all acts necessary or proper in connection with or for carrying out this resolution.

Phillips: This is for the seven employees?

Damiani: Seven titles and six employees.

11. New Business

Phillips: Do any members have anything to bring before the Board? Since there are no comments, Executive Director would you like to update us on the Materials Recovery Facility?

Damiani: Contract #1 for the equipment with Van Dyk Baler are in the process of designing and building the equipment. We expect the equipment to arrive the first week of December. We had the initial interview with Butler and we look forward to signing the contract early next week. They acknowledged they have no comments to the contract and updated pricing schedule. Contracts 3 through 6 that are in front of you this evening have to do with the improvements to the facility. We are expanding the facility by 15,000 square feet. Currently, we have three bays that we used to receive material in, but we will now have five bays to receive material. For those municipality's that collect their own material there will be less waiting time. We are working towards being fully operable in October 2022.

Phillips: Does anyone have any questions?

Kohut: Which direction is the expansion going?

Damiani: It is going to the East side.

Phillips: Do we have any public comments? Since there is no public comment, do we have a motion
